# **Bridging Dreams: Connecting villages to progress**

**Project details** : Construction of High Level Bridge over Mayurakshi river on Murabahal - Makarampur Road under Rural Infrastructure Development

Fund (RIDF)

**Project Location** : Block- Dumka, District- Dumka

Year of completion : 2023

: ₹19442.78 lakh, RIDF loan- ₹15554.22 lakh Financials

## **Challenges:**

• During flooding of Mayurakshi river in rainy seasons, local community

was cut off from schools, hospitals, main town, etc.

• Difficulty in transporting agricultural produce

#### Intervention:

• Construction of longest bridge in Jharkhand stretching over 2.5 km

## Impact:

- Better connectivity to 16000 residents of 15 villages
- Reduction of about 45 km travel distance
- Tourist spot Masanjore Dam more accessible to tourists
- Improved quality of life and livelihood options





# From Reservoir to Taps: How piped water poured life into villages

Project details : Construction of Ranka-Ramkanda Rural Piped

Drinking Water Supply Scheme under RIDF

Year of completion : 2023

Location : Block- Ranka-Ramakanda, District- Garhwa

Total Financial Outlay : ₹7871.90 lakh; RIDF Loan: ₹2815.84 lakh

#### **Challenges**

- Acute water scarcity in LWE-affected Ranka-Ramkanda
- Contaminated drinking water and travelling of long distances impacting health and education

#### Intervention

 Piped water supply from Anaraj Dam under Jal Jeevan Mission with RIDF support

#### **Impact**

- Safe water access for approx. 62,000 people in 30 villages
- Improved health, education, and generated employment opportunities







# Road to Prosperity: A step towards inclusion, development, and dignity

Project details : Reconstruction of Kochedega - Ramrekha Dham Road

(27.325 Km) under RIDF

Year of completion : 2021

Location : Block- Pakar Tanr, District- Simdega

Financials : Total Financial Outlay: ₹6735.98 lakh; RIDF Loan: ₹5388.78 lakh

## **Challenges**

 Remote tribal villages in Pakar Tanr block remained isolated due to lack of all-weather roads, affecting access to health, education, and markets

#### Intervention

• A 27 km road project was undertaken

by Govt. Of Jharkhand, overcoming forest and hilly terrain with concessional RIDF loan

#### **Impact**

 Improved connectivity for 15 villages & access to services, boosting tourism at Ramrekha Dham, and enhancing local livelihoods







# Reviving Subarnarekha: Accelerating irrigation and water security across Eastern India

Project details : Subernarekha Multipurpose Project (SMP), Jharkhand : Construction of Chandil and Icha dams & Galudih and Kharkai Barrages across river Subarnarekha and Kharkai respectively under Long Term Irrigation Fund (LTIF)

: ₹1020.44 crore sanctioned in two tranches towards State share; total revised cost ₹7579.58 crore.

### **Challenges**

**Financials** 

 Subarnarekha Multipurpose Project, an inter-state irrigation initiative, faced decades-long delay despite its potential to benefit Jharkhand, Odisha, and West Bengal.

 Originally designed in 1982, the project required massive infrastructure including dams, barrages, and canal networks, with escalating costs over time.

#### Intervention

Under PMKSY, the project was fast-

tracked through the LTIF instituted in NABARD. Construction of two dams, two barrages across river Subarnarekha and Kharkai, with two main canals offtaking from both side of the head works with an extensive network of canal system.

#### **Impact**

 Irrigation potential of 1.07 lakh ha created in Jharkhand, supporting agriculture, aquaculture, drinking, and industrial water needs.







# Lighting up lives through rural innovation: Solar power brings hope to remote Pahariya village

Project details : Solar electrification of remote Hilltop villages in

Jharkhand under Rural Infrastructure Promotion

Fund (RIPF)

Location : Village- Hensakocha, Block Chandil, Seraikela-

Kharsawan district

Financials : Grant of ₹ 9.19 Lakh

## **Challenges**

 Remote hilltop villages in Seraikela-Kharsawan were non-electrified, affecting health, education, and livelihoods.

#### Intervention

 NABARD partnered with TRCSC to provide solar street lighting and home electrification to 34 households of Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Group (Pahariya tribe) under RIPF.

#### **Impact**

 Improved health, extended working hours, better education access, and enhanced connectivity for PVTG communities.







## E-Shakti: The mother of rural innovations

Project Details : Integrating SHG members into the national

Financial Inclusion agenda by leveraging digital tools to streamline banking interactions

Location : Ramgarh, Jharkhand

Date of Launching : 15 March 2015

#### Challenges

• Manual record-keeping led to inefficiencies and delays in banking services

- Limited access to reliable data hindered banks' ability to assess SHG creditworthiness
- Difficulty in tracking SHG progress and loan recovery performance
- Challenges in delivering government benefits and Direct Benefit Transfers (DBT) efficiently

#### Intervention

- Creation of a digital platform to maintain SHG records
- One-click access for bankers to SHG social and financial data
- Integration with Aadhaar for seamless DBT and benefit transfers
- Real-time monitoring of SHG activities and loan performance



## **Impact**

• Improved transparency and accountability in SHG operations

• Enhanced confidence among bankers, leading to faster loan disbursements

• Streamlined delivery of government schemes and social benefits

• Strengthened convergence with other welfare initiatives





# **Strengthening Financial Inclusion in Mission Mode**

#### **Purpose**

- Financial Literacy, support technology adoption, installation of connectivity gadgets and improving regulatory infrastructure
- Equitable access to affordable financial services, greater financial inclusion and spread of financial literacy in rural areas

#### **Challenges**

- Lack of financial awareness in the rural hinterland primarily due to inaccessibility
- Cultural and demographic factors influencing financial behaviour
- Inadequate tech infrastructure of formal public financial institutions

#### **Interventions**

- Financial and Digital Literacy Camps To Spread financial literacy with awareness creation and understanding of financial products, particularly digital services
- Demo Vans Deployment of demonstration vans and kiosks in unbanked villages for creation of financial awareness, expanding outreach and providing financial services
- Nukkad Natak A powerful medium of communication that combines

drama, dialogue, and direct audience interaction for information dissemination with emotional and cultural storytelling

#### **Impact**

- Visible outcome noticed in the increase in deposits and credits of banks and other financial institutions
- Protection of rural poor from fraudulent financial and digital transactions
- Increase enrolment for social security schemes such as Atal Pension Yojana, Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana Pradhan and Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana





# **Leda Rural Haat: A hope for the hinterland**

## **Project Details**

- · Location: Leda Panchayat in Giridih
- ₹15 lakh support from Gramya Vikas Nidhi of NABARD
- Rural Haat with contemporary infrastructure and conveniences

## **Challenges**

- Dilapidated market place devoid of proper amenities
- Low price realisation for sellers & vendors
- Trust deficit of local villagers due to failed development initiatives in past

#### Interventions:

- Concrete and covered sheds, solar lighting, public utilities, proper drainage system, etc
- Vendors to use a 10 MT solar cold room for storage installed by a local FPO
- Pavement blocks and *chabutara* from 15<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission funds

#### **Impact**

- Weekly haat is now bi-weekly with footfalls quadrupled
- Arrival of vendors from other districts HQ for sale and purchase
- The haat has become a model of rural infrastructure-led development







## **Brush with Fame - Sohrai Women artists Rise & Shine**

## **Project Details:**

- LEDP on GI-tagged Sohrai-Khovar art
- 90 SHG women trained in Barkagaon block implemented through NGO Winner With You

## **Challenges:**

- Low remuneration, lack of tools and market
- No formal recognition of talent
- No formal training, credit inadequacy

#### Interventions:

 Capacity building, marketing platforms, online sales, exposure visits, demo unit, GI tagging

## Impact:

- Monthly income of ₹3,000-₹4,000
- ₹32 lakh bank loans, Amazon listings, media coverage
- State-level awards and visibility boosting confidence of artisans







# Empowering Bhagaiyya- The silk route through NABARD's LEDP scheme

#### **Project Details**

- Location: Bhagaiya in Godda district also known as 'Silk City' of Jharkhand
- Livelihood Enterprise Development Programme (LEDP) of NABARD for 90 SHG members for income enhancement
- To bring about fusion of traditional art with modern fashion

## **Challenges**

- Traditional silk weaving not in sync with consumer preference
- Uncompetitive products with limited access to external markets.

#### **Interventions**

• 20-days intensive training on intricate

Madhubani and Sohrai paintings on silk ties, sarees, stoles, etc.

- Exposure visits, refresher training, raw material support, and enterprise management sessions.
- Setting up of common production workshop and market facilitation through exhibitions.

#### **Impact**

- Market-driven, high-value silk products with attractive designs and competitive pricing.
- Demand for Madhubani and Sohrai painted silk ties growing nationwide.
- GI registration of Bhagaiya silk in process to ensure long-term sustainability and outreach of the products to niche customers





# Marketing Initiative: Bringing Customers and Producers onto one platform

#### **Project Details:**

- 10 day long National level silk exhibition cum sales Expo for silk handlooms.
- 5 Day long Diwali Mela for products made by SHGs, OFPOs, Weavers, craftsmen, etc
- 3 Day State Level Mango Festival for beneficiaries of TDF projects and FPOs

- from bulk buyers thus reflecting strong consumer demand and artisan success.
- More than 400 quintals of natural and chemical free mangoes of diverse varieties were sold besides other food products in the mango festival.
- Such exhibitions facilitate cross-learning among artisans/sellers in areas such as marketing strategies, branding techniques, and effective customer engagement

## **Challenges:**

- Limited physical marketing opportunities for rural artisans
- Lack of marketing avenues and inadequate transportation facilities
- Rural producers have limited exposure in consumer preferences, customer engagement, and product pricing strategies

#### Interventions:

- Classilk Expo More than 60 Stalls sponsored by NABARD in the grand silk expo at Radisson Blu Hotel, Ranchi to celebrate and promote the rich heritage of Indian handlooms and silk industries. Rare and exquisite weaves from all the States.
- Diwali Mela NABARD sponsored 70 Stalls providing a vibrant
  - platform for showcasing rural craftsmanship. 140 rural artisans, weavers, producers, and members of SHGs/ JLGs FPOs OFPOs from across the country participated.
- State-level Mango festival-Organised by NABARD for beneficiaries of TDF and FPO projects.

## Impact:

 The Silk Expo and Diwali Mela generated recorded sales turnover more than ₹30 crore followed by repeat orders







# Giridih's FPOs adopt green energy

#### **Project Details**

- 3 NABARD promoted FPOs and 5 farmers of NABARD supported FPOs have been credit-linked under AIF
- Established solar cold rooms (10 MT capacity) and 7 solar-based processing units
- Unique loan-grant model with 50-70% subsidy via SELCO & banks.
- Focus on farm-gate storage, clean tech, and value chain

## **Challenges**

• High energy costs and post-harvest losses

• Dependency on chemical inputs and fossil fuels

#### **Interventions**

- Solar-powered mills, dryers, and cold rooms deployed
- FPO-led awareness on organic farming and clean energy

#### **Impact**

- Reduced carbon footprint, improved soil health, and energy savings
- Shift to climate-resilient farming and sustainable agri practices





# **Lac to Luxury - Soto's Scientific Leap to success**

## **Project Details:**

- Scheme: Tribal Resilience Initiative for Building Environmentally Sustainable Livelihoods (TRIBES)
- Implementing Agency: Nav Bharat Jagriti Kendra
- Location: Jiuri village, Murhu block in Khunti district
- Beneficiary: Shri Soto Manki

## **Challenges:**

- · Low yields from traditional lac and paddy farming
- Lack of capital and forced migration
- Limited livelihood opportunities

#### Interventions:

- Scientific lac cultivation (Semialata & Kusum)
- Training in brood inoculation, marketing support
- Investment in soilless tomato and watermelon farming

#### Impact:

- ₹1.8 lakh/cycle earned from lac
- Area under lac expanded to 4.5 acres
- Built pucca house, bought tractor, supported family livelihoods
- Became a local agri-entrepreneur



# Feathers of Fortune: Women wing their way to wealth

#### **Project Details**

 A women-led poultry cooperative, established in 2010 in Godda district was supported under Umbrella Programme on Natural Resource Management (UPNRM) and Tribal Development Fund (TDF)

## **Challenges**

- · Lack of capital
- Inadequate and untimely access to chicks, feed, vaccines and related inputs
- Inadequate market linkages

#### **Interventions**

- NABARD provided financial assistance under UPNRM and TDF for purchase of equipment
- Working capital support to the members of the society

#### **Impact**

• Increase in income upto ₹ 55000

- Cooperative could achieve a record turnover of ₹ 7 crore
- Credit linkage of the Cooperative and regular repayments





# Watershed moment: From ridge to riches

#### **Project Details**

- Location: Rajpura Gram Panchayat, Devipur Block, Deoghar, Jharkhand
- Covered 10 villages under Jaleshwar Watershed initiative
- Focused on climate-resilient agriculture and soil & water conservation
- Led by NABARD with support from local institutions and farmers

#### **Challenges**

- Erratic rainfall, poor soil health, and low crop yield
- Farmers lacked awareness, resources, and climate-smart agricultural practices

#### **Interventions**

- Soil testing, deep ploughing, and organic nutrient enrichment
- Crop diversification, kitchen gardens, and farmer training sessions

### **Impact**

- Productivity and crop yield has increased significantly
- 700+ farmers received soil health cards
- 300+ women have set up kitchen gardens resulting in better nutrition and income



# Tech in the Trenches: Binod's smart farm breakthrough

## **Project Details**

- Introduction of precision farming by integration of automated irrigation system, moisture sensors and weather forecasting device in Churchu Block, Hazaribagh
- Binod Kumar, a member of NABARD-supported Dadi Sanyukt FPO adopted smart farm tech across 20 acres of leased land

#### **Challenges**


- Traditional farming with low yield
- Climate change resulting in adverse impact on agriculture
- Poor market access and rising input cost

#### **Interventions**

- NABARD supported of IFFCO introduction Kisan enabled ICT and IoT precision devices in the farms
- FPO membership brought better prices and smart farming practices

### **Impact**

- Enhancement in productivity and reduction in input cost
- Binod's smart farm has become a beacon of innovation in Jharkhand, drawing attention of farmers, State Govt. officials and agriculturist





## Seeds of success: Women FPO lead with tech in tow

## **Project Details**

- An all women FPO formed in 2021 in Itkhori Block, Chatra with more than 400 shareholders including SC/ST farmers and SHG members
- Promoted under Central Sector Scheme implemented by NABARD
- Focused on mustard oil, goat farming, pulses, and vegetables
- ₹6.4 lakh share capital; ₹7.5 lakh loan for oil mill setup under PMFME

#### Challenges

- Poor infrastructure, low income, and limited market access
- Lack of awareness and tech adoption among rural farmers

#### **Interventions**

- Establishment of mustard oil mill, promotion of goatery, and crop diversification
- Blockchain tech and E-NAM used for schemes and market linkage

#### **Impact**

- 1600+ farmers accessed subsidized seeds through the FPO
- Women empowerment with capacity building programmes for Board members and CFO
- Enhancement in income and reduction in input costs





# JIVA - Sowing nature & harvesting hope in Patratu, Jharkhand

#### **Project Details**

**Project** 

: JIVA is an agroecology-based programme under NABARD's watershed and wadi initiatives. It aims to promote natural farming for long-term sustainability, leveraging existing social and natural capital. The project began in 2023 to transition farmers from chemical-intensive practices to natural farming.

Location : Patratu Block, Ramgarh District, Jharkhand

Implementing : Gramin Seva Sangh

Partner

### **Challenges**

· High cost of agricultural inputs

• Dependence on chemical fertilizers and pesticides

Low crop productivity

• Limited awareness of natural farming techniques

Inadequate livestock management practices

#### **Interventions**

- Capacity building of 80 lead farmers across 8 JIVA clusters in 6 villages
- Promotion and use of bio-inputs like Jeevamrit, Beejamrit, Ghanjeevamrit, and Neemastra
- Cultivation on 90+ acres using indigenous crop varieties (paddy, vegetables, pulses, oilseeds)
- Establishment of 43 kitchen gardens and 43 bio-resource units

#### **Impact**

- Reduced input costs and improved soil health
- Paddy yield increased from 17–18 quintals/acre to 20–22 quintals/acre
- Year-round cultivation and better market access
- Improved household nutrition and food security
- Strengthened community cohesion through participatory action



# From cane to gain - Sweet change in Hazaribagh through NABARD's Farm Sector Promotion Fund (FSPF)

## **Project Details**

Project

: Scientific Sugarcane Cultivation and Jaggery Marketing under FSPF. The project focuses on scientific sugarcane cultivation, strengthening the jaggery value chain, and expanding market opportunities for Barkagaon's Jaggery—a regional delicacy known for purity and flavour as well as identified under ODOP.

Location : Barkagaon, Hazaribagh District, Jharkhand

Beneficiaries: 324 farmers

## **Challenges**

Low profitability in traditional sugarcane farming

Limited market access for jaggery products

· Lack of value addition and branding

#### Interventions

- Introduction of scientific cultivation practices
- Establishment of jaggery processing unit for production, processing, and packaging
- Launch of three product variants: Dheli Gur, Masala Gur, and Liquid Gur
- Listing of products on e-NAM and ONDC platforms for wider market outreach

#### **Impact**

- Introduction of new sugarcane variety (CoP18436) resistant to rodent damage
- Enhanced farmer income through value addition and diversified product range
- Strengthened local economy and created sustainable market linkages







# Climate Resilience in Action: Pradhan Mahto's journey to sustainable farming

Project Details : National Adaptation Fund for Climate Change

(NAFCC) aimed to build climate resilience through soil and moisture conservation, water harvesting, gender-sensitive livelihoods, and energy efficiency

Location : Palani village, Patratu, Ramgarh district

Year of Sanction : 2017-18

Beneficiary : Pradhan Mahto

## **Challenges**

 The village faced severe soil erosion due to steep slopes, seasonal water scarcity limiting Rabi irrigation, low crop productivity, and deteriorating water harvesting structures

#### **Interventions**

- NAFCC supported drainage line repairs, while the farmer undertook land levelling and bunding
- Loose boulder check dams were built. Awareness sessions promoted soil and water conservation practices

#### **Impact**

- Rabi cropping increased with wheat and lentils cultivated on 1.2 acres.
- Income rose with ₹10,000 from wheat sales and ₹2,500/month from milk sales
- Improved water availability and fodder access enabled livestock expansion and sustained livelihoods





# Strengthening of Rural Financial Institutions (RFIs) - Amalgamation & Technology Adoption

#### **Project Details**

Seven erstwhile DCCBs were amalgamated to form Jharkhand State Cooperative Bank (JStCB) w.e.f 01.04.2017, creating a Two-Tier structure for greater financial stability, compliance, and governance. Dhanbad DCCB continues to be a separate entity.

Jharkhand Gramin Bank & Vananchal Gramin Bank were amalgamated into Jharkhand Rajya Gramin Bank w.e.f. 01 April 2019

## **Challenges:**

- Weak linkage, poor customer base, staff shortage, poor farmer connect
- · Low Agricultural Lending portfolio; no PACS-based lending
- Limited adoption of modern banking technology

#### **Interventions**

- Advisor & facilitator in the amalgamation and technology adoption in RFIs
- Capital Infusion to improve CRAR
- NABARD provided grant for CBS implementation and adoption of post CBS technologies

#### Impact:

- Financial strengthening & operational efficiency- Management cost reduced
- Reduction in accumulated losses of RFIs
- Expansion of PACS network as PACS affiliation increased from 1,300 to 3,363
- Better compliance to statutory norms













# Jharkhand leads the digital PACS shift

Project Details : First in the nation to implement PACS Computerisation at scale : 1500 PACS selected in

Phase 1 out of 4450 total in Jharkhand

Hardware support : Computers, Printers, Biometric kits, Modems

## Challenges

- Manual records caused delays, errors, and data loss
- No real-time access hindered planning and audits

#### **Interventions**

- ERP system enabled online operations and audits
- PACS digitized services: loans, deposits, member records
- Training & tech support extended till 2027 via System Integrators

#### **Impact**

- 1485 PACS live on ERP; 785 use it daily
- 1385 audits completed online; efficiency improved







# Bhalpahari Taratand Primary Agricultural Cooperative Credit Society (PACS) - Banking at grassroot

Project Details	:	Bhalpahari Taratand PACS supported under Cooperative Development Fund (CDF)
Location	:	Gandey Block, Giridih District, Jharkhand
Financials:		₹2.36 lakh (2022–23) for infrastructure development
Membership:		Over 900 members

## **Challenges**

- Region affected by Naxalism, poor health and education indicators, depleting natural resources, migration and lack of infrastructure
- High cost of doing business due to exploitation and administrative gaps, need for accessible and affordable credit

#### **Interventions**

- NABARD support for cash counter, furniture (chairs, almirahs), power backup, CCTV surveillance, currency counting machine
- PACS provided hassle-free loans at competitive interest rates (e.g., 9% for business loans), doorstep banking services

#### **Impact**

- PACS transformed into a trusted financial institution in the region, Deposits increased from ₹7.35 crore to ₹7.75 crore (YoY), Advances grew from ₹3.5 crore to ₹3.81 crore (YoY)

Lack of adequate post-harvest storage facilities in rural areas


- High levels of crop wastage due to poor infrastructure
